

City guide



Brno is a city in the South Moravian Region of the Czech Republic.

Located at the confluence of the Svitava and Svratka rivers, Brno has about 380,000 inhabitants, making it the secondlargest city in the Czech Republic after the capital, Prague, and one of the 100 largest cities in the EU.

TRAVELING TO BRNO

It is probable that there won't be direct flights from your country to Brno. In that case, you will need to travel either to Prague or Vienna first. If you are not sure how to get to Brno from there, feel free to check this <u>link</u> where you can find useful information about transportation to Brno from different airports.

You can find information on how to get to the city centre once you arrive in Brno <u>here</u> (bottom of the page). Note that the main railway station and Grand Hotel bus station are both within walking distance of the city centre, so you might not need to use public transport, depending on your destination.

If you are not sure how to get around Brno, you can check this <u>website</u>, where you can find public transport connections in the city. All the public transport stops are also visible on Google Maps.

The Brno Public Transport Authority serves the whole city with public transport. See further details on how it works <u>here</u>. You can also purchase a ticket in the vehicle with <u>Beep and Go</u>.

PLACES TO SEE IN BRNO

As the second-largest city in Czech Republic, Brno is full of historical buildings and interesting places. Here's a list of a few of them that are worth visiting:

- <u>The Cathedral of St Peter and Paul</u> a gothic cathedral which today represents one of the city's most prominent landmarks
- <u>Špilberk castle</u> a castle and fortress forming a dominant feature of the city of Brno
- <u>Villa Tugendhat</u> an architecturally significant building, one of the prototypes of modern architecture in Europe
- <u>Moravian Gallery in Brno</u> the secondlargest art museum in the Czech Republic
- <u>Vida Science centre</u> science centre with more than one hundred and eighty interactive exhibits
- Ossuary at the Church of St James a place formerly used to inter the skeletal remains from graves with a mystical atmosphere
- <u>Old Town Hall</u> significant historical building with a lookout tower with amazing views of Brno

- <u>Brno Observatory and Planetarium</u> science centre near a beautiful city park where you can look into the microworld, discover the secrets of life and much more
- <u>ZOO Brno</u> located on the outskirts of Brno, there you can see more than 2218 animals of 408 species and various exhibits
- <u>Brno Reservoir</u> a great place for rest and recreation located close to Brno Zoo, Veveří castle and Brno dam

Wi-Fi Access

A majority of Masaryk University's premises are covered by a Wi-Fi network. MU uses eduroam, a world-wide network that enables internet connection at most academic institutions around the world based on the principle of a unified login.

The basic requirement for using eduroam is an active relationship with MU or another academic institution included in the eduroam project. That means that if your university also uses the eduroam system, the login and password from your home university should also work at Masaryk University. If you have no login details for eduroam wi-fi, feel free to contact your contact person at MU to assign you new eduroam wi-fi credentials before your arrival to Brno.

If you are not familiar with eduroam or your university doesn't use it, please see the information <u>here</u>. Keep in mind that in order to be able to use the eduroam system, you must set it up before your arrival at Masaryk university.
